PLATINUM JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS Update

March onwards

Everyone is encouraged to create window boxes, hanging baskets and front garden plots planted with flowers of red, white and blue, timed to be at their best the first week in June. Certificates will be awarded for best judged displays.

The judging will take place in Jubilee Week commencing Monday 30th May 2022 with awards presented on Sunday 5th June 2022 at the **Big Lunch** (see below). Entry forms will soon be available in the shop (£1 per entry).

Bunting is needed to hang around the village including the shop and the hall – made from environmentally friendly material. Volunteers are needed to make a metre or so each – more details to follow, but if you are interested in helping or can supply some material, please email <u>buxton443@btinternet.com</u>

A Grand Jubilee Prize Draw – tickets will be on sale from March.

Thursday 2nd June

Village Fete on the Green between 11am and 5pm with stalls and activities. (Setting up from 8am). Arrangements will be made to erect the Horticultural Society Marquee to provide some sheltered space, if the weather forecast is truly awful the Parish Hall will be available as supplementary back up.

Anyone who wishes to book a space/table and can provide a gazebo please email <u>ibuxton16@btinternet.com</u> – once we have a list of likely participants, we can draw up a plan for spaces on the green. (A fee of £5.00 per stall/table will go towards any costs incurred and any surplus donated to the church funds.). Each stall/table can use the event to raise funds for their own organisation or charity of choice.

A variety of activities will be staged throughout the day including fancy dress competitions for both adults and children with a Royalty theme. Parade of 'best turned out' horses and rider. Royalty themed Scarecrow competition. Best dressed 'royal' dog! There will be prizes for the winners, to be presented at the **Big Lunch** on 5th June.

Ashwater School are arranging for the children to create artwork that will be on display in the hall throughout the four days of celebration.

National Beacon Lighting We are looking into holding an evening parade to coincide with the National Beacon Lighting, it is hoped the Ashwater Beacon will be lit at 9.45pm.

A **Quiz** will be held in the Parish Hall. Doors open at 7pm. Prizes will be given for the winners of each round and to the overall champions. Teams of four at £2.00 per head, there will be a limited pay bar and light refreshments available to purchase. Tickets will be on sale nearer the day.

Saturday 4th June

A Craft Fair in the Parish Hall, probably 10am – 2pm.

A **Ceilidh** in the Parish Hall, doors open at 6.45pm, with live music from **SPINACH FOR NORMAN**, four-piece band (two fiddles, guitar & bass) and caller **PAM HAYES**. 7pm to Midnight. There will be two short interludes, a bar and a finger buffet. Tickets at £5.00 per head will be on sale nearer the night.

Sunday 5th June

Church Service (probably 11am) in the Church.

The **Big Lunch** from 12 noon onwards in the Parish Hall and outside on the grassed area. We are exploring the possibility of a Hog Roast to supplement a Bring and Share Lunch, patriotic dressing up is encouraged, but optional. More details as arrangements are made.
