### EXTENSION FUND

Thank you to all who managed to vote for our project with AVIVA, but we were not successful in securing sufficient votes on this occasion.

We have raised circa £40,000 towards our goal of £75,000 which includes some work on the car park and a contingency allowance. Once we are a bit closer to the estimated end figure we will be seeking tenders for the building work and hopefully this will be in the late Spring of 2018. Meanwhile we would welcome any donations towards the project.

### HALL COSTS

Hall running costs are met from hire charges and fund-raising events. Last month the newsletter outlined the type of expenses involved, but did not mention any actual figures.

The accounts are always available and copies of the annual return of income and expenditure are distributed at the Annual General Meeting. The trustees who are all volunteers, meet regularly and are provided with details including a balance sheet by the treasurer. Should anyone require a copy of these interim figures please contact any of the trustees and these will be provided.

It seems there has been some recent general discussion about the 'bar charge' of £25.00 at events hosting the sale and consumption of alcohol. Ever since the hall opened the hall has published details of the hire charges and these have always included a £25.00 fee when a bar has been declared and operated. This is done to help offset the annual licence fee paid by the hall to Torridge District Council that enables events to be held in the hall without the need for the hirer to apply for, secure and pay for a 'Temporary Event Notice'.

Hirers are reminded that if a bar is being operated they are obliged to notify the hall at the time of booking and to ensure a responsible adult is in charge at the event. The area within the hall where alcohol may be sold and/or consumed does not include the car park, toilets or grounds beyond the external canopy area, for safety reasons. A plan of the area is always on display in the main hall.

Money received from the bookings this financial year so far, is approximately £3,700 with the cost of goods and services amounting to around £3,900, (excluding electricity which benefits from income from the solar/pv panels in the summer months). This indicates the level of hire charges is reasonable bearing in mind there are other expenses, such as ongoing maintenance. These additional costs (which also include such things as insurance) are invariably met from donations and events organised by the hall trustees.

The trustees have always ensured that a reasonable contingency fund is kept in reserve for unexpected expenditure and this is particularly

### **Shop Lease**

The hall and the shop/PO are mutually advantageous, both run for the benefit of the parish (and beyond). A new 7year lease has been agreed to enable the shop/PO to continue operating within the hall grounds at a peppercorn rent. Both utilise the same electricity supplier, thus gaining some economy of scale on unit price and sharing the feed in tariff generated by the solar/pv panels on the hall roof. At present both the hall and shop/PO are granted dispensation from business rates thus helping each to thrive, but above all it is the support shown by the hall hirers and shop customers aided by the voluntary work and commitment of committee members that ensures Ashwater continues to profit from these facilities. We wish them all a very happy Christmas.

#### **HOLSWORTHY WALK AND TALK**

With variable weather conditions during November we have done well to enjoy several of those lovely autumnal days on our walk with a particularly lovely day on 17<sup>th</sup> November. We met at the Village Hall in Halwill Junction and set off in an anti-clockwise direction initially following a short section of the old railway line leading down onto Blackhill Road. The country road was so quiet it was difficult to imagine the hustle and bustle of the A3079 just a few metres away. After a mile or so we turned left again and came to bridleway crossing Whiddon Moor and then out onto Dreybury Lane back into the village passing the old Winsford Cottage Hospital.

Winsford Cottage Hospital was designed by Charles Francis Annesley Voysey (1857-1941) who was an influential Arts and Crafts architect. He was commissioned to design the hospital in 1900 by Maria (Molly) Webb-Medley of Winsford Tower Halwill (demolished in 1950) in memory of her husband George for the community of Halwill and its surrounding 14 parishes. The design of the hospital was unique as Voysey's other works were of private houses. His trademark attention to detail incorporated the combining of sanitary and practical considerations with an understanding of the requirements of both nursing staff and patients. An innovation such as cross-ventilation in each ward served by separate flues was included together with level floors throughout for wheelchair access all offset by cheerful yellow mosaic tiled flooring in the hallway, corridors and veranda.

The Winsford Trust came into being in 1999, led by the Winsford Hospital League Friends who are now working with the Landmark Trust to sympathetically renovate the building to form accommodation for two holiday apartments together with an area for community use.

We are fortunate to live in an area with such diversity of scenery and history which is often brought to life by our walkers, one of whom told us that he had been born in Winsford Hospital. Such stories add to the enjoyment

of the walks. Added to that are the benefits of walking which has been shown to reduce the risk of many common conditions including heart disease, high blood pressure and Type 2 diabetes and all walks are free.

Our Monday walks in Stanhope Park, Holsworthy start at 10.30 am from The Scout Hut next to the Leisure Centre with tea and coffee served afterwards in the Youth Centre. The Friday walks move off at 10.30 am from various locations around the area. Details can be found on our walk programme. The latest edition covering November 2017 to February 2018 is now available.
